

Private Residence, Caulfield, Melbourne, 2010



Formal entry courtyard

Our clients wanted to create a modern minimalist garden in sympathy with their new architect designed residence. It was to include large useable areas for entertaining and family recreation, and a swimming pool.

Built on a busy main road; high masonry garden walls enclose the space creating a series of walled gardens, reducing traffic noise and creating privacy.

The main entry is entered through a formal copse of ornamental pear trees set in a simple turfed courtyard. Rectilinear sandstone banding is used to break up this large lawn area and create a rhythm in sympathy with the architecture.

Planting is strong and simple using a minimal palette to reflect the modern design. The use of synthetic grass reduces maintenance and provides a consistent finish.
