

## "The Masters" Residential Development, 2012, Bayview Investments

Sturt Noble Associates were asked by Bayview Investments to redesign "the Masters" Residential Development at Darley Street West Bayview.

A previous landscape scheme had been installed and did not meet either the client or the market expectations for the multi-million dollar apartments.

Sturt Noble Associates redesigned the landscape to a high end resort standard using advanced plant stock and on site direction to great effect.

Specimen trees, palms and accent planting were used to lift the presentation to the entry and advanced planting used to soften the built form. Species included strong architectural plantings of Alcantarea imperialis, Cordylines, Zamia furfuracea, Doryanthes excelsa, Asplenium nidus and Furcraea foetida.

Hedges of advanced specimens of waterhousia "sweeper", Acmena smithii minor and Syzgium provide additional privacy to bedroom windows along pathways.
